- Our teachers are committed to supporting the teaching profession and are welcoming a Red Deer College student teacher, Ms. Kathleen Easthope, to our grade 4 team; who will be with us every Tuesday and then full-time starting in February for 9 weeks..

### School Wide Opening Liturgy (Stacey)

- A pre-recorded liturgy including songs, prayers, videos and a follow up activity for classes is being created by students/staff from Gr. 5 Edens and Gr. 3 Pearson.
- HFS staff and students will view the liturgy on Sept. 24 at 10:45am from their own classrooms following a unified prayer as a school community over the intercom.

# Believe in God: The BIG block (Stacey)

- BIG (Believe in God) lessons are faith based and taught to all Kindergarten to Grade 5 students 13 times throughout the year by Mrs. Bussard, Mrs. Weddell, and Mrs. Martz. While the children receive a BIG lesson, their classroom teacher is given the opportunity to professionally collaborate with their grade team members.
- The first BIG lesson has students learning about our school division faith theme, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart." Activities, conversations and reflections about trust have been meaningful for both staff and students.
- The lessons will promote student's spiritual well being through activities and discussions specifically tied to the school division faith characteristics of justice and hospitality (i.e. God glasses, prayer)

#### Schedule Changes (Stacey)

- Supervision: outside supervision starts at 8:12 am and ends after school at 3:15 pm
- Staggered Entry and Dismissal
- Staggered Recesses
- Lunch: with the changes to the division calendar we were able to increase lunch eating time from 15 minutes to 20 minutes

### Physical Education and Recess Time (Stacey)

 Our Phys. Ed. team has been busy taking all phys.ed. and recess equipment and preparing cohort bins of equipment to be used within each of the classroom cohorts during phys ed and recess.
Students are able to play in close contact with others in their classroom cohorts and social distance play with friends from other classroom cohorts. Students will use hand sanitizer/wash hands prior and after recess and physical education.
