# COVID-19

#### Mindful Mondays

Mindful Mondays touch on respect, kindness and our growth mindset in different ways. In the month of November we have focused on the following with our students:

- Nov. 23rd Focusing on the seven sacred teaching of the Buffalo: Respect (aligning with the Virtue/Asset monthly Focus)
- Nov. 16th We learned about St. Martin de Porres, his feast day is November 3rd, and is the patron saint of mixed-race people and the struggles he went through during his life. His nickname was *Brother Broom* as no chore was too small for him
- Nov. 9th Remembrance Day: "I am proud to be Canadian where at least I know I'm free, And I won't forget the men & women who died, who gave that right to me." ` Anonymous

# ALBERTA EDUCATION SURVEY

The results of the Alberta Education survey that parents completed in January/February 2020 have been shared with schools. The results of these surveys are used to help guide programs in the school, address school needs and celebrate the great things we do here at Holy Family School.

Holy Family is an excellent school community where families and staff care deeply about student learning in all areas and work together to achieve this. Staff have high expectations and work hard to meet individual students where they are at to best meet their needs in all areas of development.

We have an excellent report card; results reflect that Holy Family is well above the provincial average in all areas.

The table below highlights results in each of the areas of the survey. Our results of the survey show that we have grown in all areas. Of these areas the most notable is 'continuous improvement' we have a significant increase of 8% which is a direct correlation of the work our staff and community have done. Many schools in our division are adopting our practices and strategies in our work around Career Day, Formative Assessment and Response to Intervention in a fluid and flexible model to meet the current needs of our students through robust Mindful Monday, Soft Starts, Trauma Informed Care and allocation of resources being reviewed 3 times per year.

At this time last year we discussed the importance of developing a document highlighting the awesome work our staff and students continue to do in the four major areas of the survey. This was done and shared with our grade 4 parents to assist with completing the survey.
