

Safe Harbour is an organization that provides a warm place for the Homeless People of Red Deer. In winter, they like to give the people that stay there a clean pair of socks when they come in to help keep them warm. The Grade 3s will be organizing a winter sock drive that will look a little different this year. We are inviting children to wear their favourite warm, fuzzy socks on Friday, November 4th. We will be collecting a **toonie** from those who wish to donate. All money collected will go towards purchasing new adult socks. Safe Harbour goes through about 1200 pairs of socks a month. November Curriculum Update:

In Language Arts this month we will continue to work on 4 of our Daily 5 activities including the following LA areas:

1. **Read to Self** - students are reading books at their own level from both the library and our classroom library. (Reminder: Our library book exchange day is Thursday each week.)
2. **Work on Writing** - various weekly writing activities (poetry, response to reading, reflection, journal writing)
3. **Listen to Reading** - students listen to levelled books on both EPIC books and Raz-Kids on our classroom Chromebooks

4. Work with Words - (phonics and spelling using letter tiles and Making Words)

In Math, we are continuing to work in the number concepts unit this month. **Please continue to practise your basic math facts to 18 with your child at home.** The students have learned a plethora of card and dice games to help solidify their basic math fact knowledge. Ask to play these games with your child at home. Please also spend a few minutes each day reviewing fact families with your child. For example,

This is called a Fact Family:

$$\begin{array}{l} 3+5=8 \\ 5+3=8 \\ 8-5=3 \\ 8-3=5 \end{array}$$

We are learning to represent and rename numbers to 1000 with numerals, words, pictures and base ten blocks. It is very important for students to become increasingly comfortable with numbers to 1000. Eventually we will be going up to 100 000 this year.

In Social Studies we are learning about the country of **Peru**. We have researched all about Peru's quality of life, customs and traditions. We are now researching about Peru's land, government, services and resources. Students are enjoying experiencing **Machu Picchu** in virtual reality on our Google Cardboards!

This month our class will also be busy creating iPeru projects culminating all they have learned about Peru.

In Science, we are continuing with our Rocks and Minerals unit. Students this month will learn about ways that rocks break down into soil and the various components within a sample of soil.
